WE were sorry to hear this Easter weekend of the death of Mike Berry, an early member of the club (no 18.)

Although I never met him I believe we shared a similarly, slightly irreverent attitude, as shown in the photograph (below) which Mike staged in Kings Park many years ago.

We were in email contact in recent years, while, according to friends and colleagues, Mike was not in the best of health. He was a keen photographer and sent me pictures taken in the early days of the club. One of the more notable was of a club AGM, held on the grass at McCallum Park.

It was part of a feature that sought club members who ran in the first, 1979, Perth Peoples Marathon.

Mike was one of them. The unfortunate bucket-carrier following him in the photo is wife Nora; but we can't name the other two walking wounded.

Possible candidates are: Bob Hayres; Dennis Batherham; Geoff Price; Jim McLean; Sid Bowler; Bob Johnstone; and Ian Sutherland.

If anyone knows, please let *Vetrun* know.

Meantime...wonder if Mike Berry used that stick to feel his way around Jorgensen? It could explain why the original course was so terrifying. We used to start in the opposite direction, which meant a blind descent through bushes into the stream.
