MAGNIFICENT MAIDEN MARATHON

Antoinette Shaw made an excellent entrance to the Perth marathon scene at the People's Marathon in July when she ran her maiden marathon in 3 hr 01 min 19 sec. Ann was the first woman home, 19th overall and a clear winner of the gold medal in the W45 bracket.

She had been running about 85 km per week in training, including speed sessions and four hours of water running for strengthening purposes.

Her longest training runs were 21 km.

Ann told The Vetrun that she approached the run firmly convinced that the key to success was to run within herself and not blow it away with too fast a pace in the early stages. She had no bad moments and finished comfortably but the next morning was so stiff she could barely put on her socks. Ann spent the postmarathon day doing housework and cleaning windows, to give herself a recovery break.

Other Vets who won gold in their age brackets were Janet Kelly (W40) in 3 hr 07 min 57 sec; and Cecil Walkley (M65) in 3 hr 52 min 34 sec.

OF COURSES & DISTANCES

I copped a bit of flack at the recent Uni & Back 15 km event from people who were upset that I had attered the course from previous ars, so I thought I had better put down my reasons and see what feedback I get.

I measure courses using my bike computer. I have calibrated this against WAMC marks for the Perth Marathon, the "standard" round the idges 10 km and two 16 km cycling time trial courses. It is within fractions of 1% for all. I always recheck before measuring a course, and I always measure twice. I am therefore fairly confident in my measurements.

For the Uni & Back I measured the rse carefully and reckoned it was soom short. As this is an out-and-back specific distance event (and part of the Road Racing Championship) and 300 m is a considerable distance in 15 km (1:12 at 4 min pace, 1:30 at 5 min etc), I felt that having the correct distance was important and lengthened the course accordingly. However, a

number of members were annoyed, as they like to compare times over the years on the same course to see if they are successfully fighting off the ravages of Father Time.

Really I think there is room for both points of view. Some "traditional" courses should be retained as they are, eg Teddy Birds, Friendship, Danby's, Cliff Bould etc; and others should be accurate, eg championship events, specific distance out and backs, even if it means some changes to existing courses.

Well, what is your opinion?? Bail me (or any committee member) up any Sunday am and gives us your opinion, so we can do what the majority want.

My run for the next three mornings was a steep 2K climb by road to the lake, thread my way past tourists at the hotel which is on the edge of the lake, then continue around lake on earthen pathway; turned at 20 minutes to return via a higher trail which was muddy due to melting snow - moss covered fir trees provided a canopy overhead. It was

exhilarating to run on fresh snow and feel the crunch as my shoes touched down -(yes, I was flying!).

On the final 2K downhill on the roadside I would wave to the tour buses—what they thought of a skinny bloke in singlet and shorts, when it was 6°, it anyone's guess. A hot shower, relaxed breakfast in our cosy cabin and the feeling was—this is paradise.

MULTI-MARATHON RUNNER WENDY DUNCAN

Wendy joined the Vets in March 1996 (her first run being Lorna's Run) after arriving to permanently live in WA from South Africa.

John Bell introduced Wendy to the Vets and the Marathon Club at the same time, however she has run most of her runs with the Vets, enjoying the Vets friendly environment. As we became familiar with Wendy, (she does like a chat as she runs, as we all know!) it was truly amazing to learn of her past achievements in less than ten years of running.

Wendy started running in May 1986 and by November 1987 had completed her first Marathon in 4:14. This was to be the first of many big "M's". Less than five months later, she completed a 56K run called "Two Oceans" in Capetown which runs from the Atlantic Ocean around the Cape to the Indian Ocean. Totally obsessed by then and less than two months later she participated in her first Comrades Marathon, 90K in 9:51, well within the 11 hour cut-off period. Wendy described this as her most rewarding running achievement.

Another training lead-up to Comrades in May 1989 identified a shin stress fracture which prevented Wendy running for five weeks prior to the big event. She completed this one in 10:16, but at a huge cost for she was not to run for another 12 months!

Not to become a "couch potatoe",

Wendy took up cycling and since then has completed in excess of seven 100K cycle races.

Back to running by May 1990, she has participated in more than 50 42.2K marathons (three in WA), 20 Ultra Marathons, including two more Comrades in 1993 and 1995. All this as well as social organiser of her club for four years and working full time!! One wonders what challenges lie ahead for Wendy.

Jim recently returned from a month in Europe where he successfully competed in a staggering three marathons.

In Stockholm, Sweden, he became dehydrated running the gruelling 42 km in 3hr 23 min in a sweltering 33 degree heatwave.

A week later at Stoke on Trent, England, his time was 3 hr 17 min.

At Tromso, Norway, the land of the Midnight Sun, 28 nationalities attended this popular marathon which started at 10 pm - Jim heard the strains of "Waltzing Matilda" as he ran for 3 hr 17 min in complete daylight! Camaraderie among the competitors was electric.

Back in Perth, he was in time for the People's Marathon, which he ran in 3 hr 23 min.

"A few screws loose "has reached Jim's ears many times but this marathon man will not lie down and die - "Why? I'm still young," he says.

Jim Barnes has been a member of the WA Veterans Athletic Club for 19 years and expresses glowing admiration for the support and encouragement from "a tough breed of men."

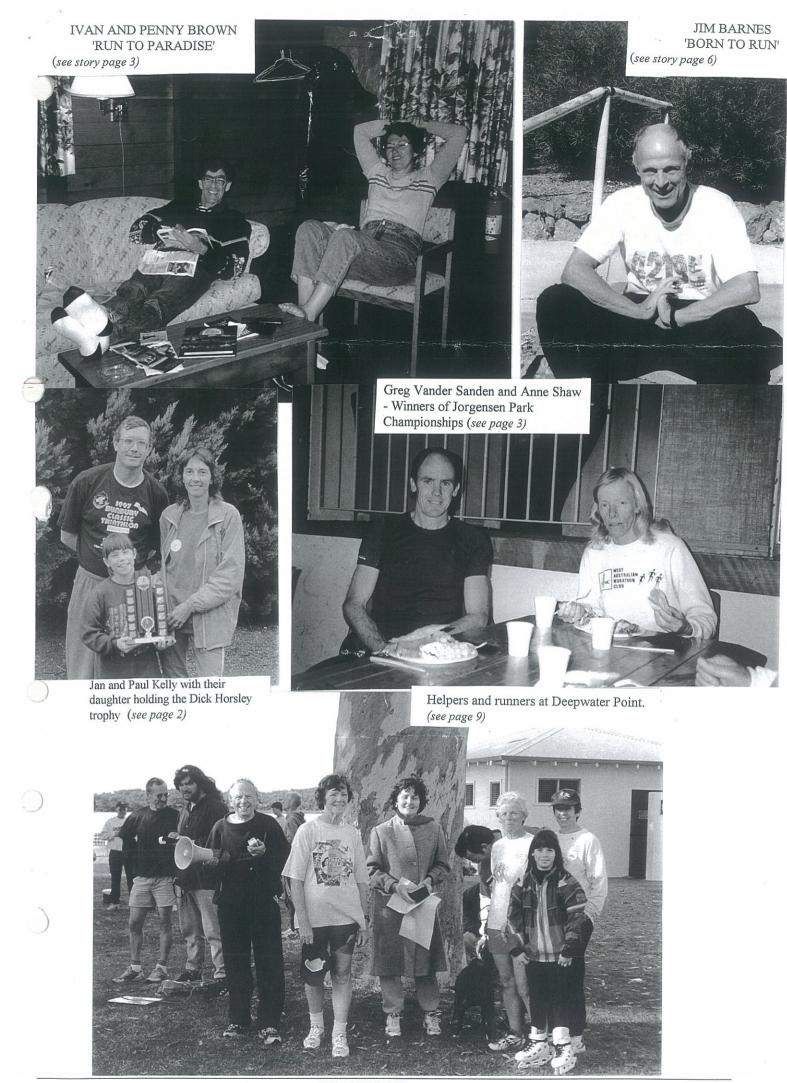
