At school Jan loved sport and was school champion in the javelin, Paul enjoyed playing soccer and represented his school in cross country running. The Kelly's met at a disco. Paul and Jan started running to exercise their dog and later joined Gloucester Athletics Club. Jan was selected for Wales in the Veterans National Cross Country team. In 1990 she was 66th in the World Ladies Marathon Championship at Luton, UK in a time of 2-48. Jan has won the Welsh Ladies half marathon championship, has won marathons in Sheffield twice, Gloucester, Leeds, Portland USA and 4th in Majorca. She was selected for her county Gloucester in the Veterans National County 10K Challenge which her county won, her time being 35.37. In 1992 she was selected to run for Wales in the International Home Counties Division of the London Marathon and ran 2-51. Paul's PB is 1-23 for the half marathon and 3-04 for a marathon. After coming to live in Perth Paul learnt to swim and has entered in two Fosters

Ironman competitions with a PB of 12hrs 11min. The Kelly's won the husband and wife division of the City to Surf in 1994. They came to Australia in 1993 and have one daughter Claire, our "adopted" grandaughter.- Joan Pellier

I remember 15 years ago I was a race director and was in trouble. I called Bob and he took over the race for me. What a great Club man he is.

A big thank you to this year's three race directors; Jimmy Barnes (10K), Gary Fisher (15K) and Jackie

Halberg(25K). It has been a good year too as 37 members, more than ever before, completed the three events, especially our ladies or lasses - an 800% improvement on last year, showing the men the way. Last year I picked Ann Turner and Dennis Miller as the consistent runners in the 50K. This year I have picked Joan Pellier and "Dave the Carr", the 800m flyer. This is just a personal thing; to try to pick THE runners in the Championships.

An inspiration to the Club. Two new members, first-time runners Eileen and "Tearaway" Brown. Since they started last November until now, they have not done a short run on a Sunday. It makes you think what the rest of us are doing. They are an inspiration to us all. Good luck Eileen and Trevor. This is the longest letter I have written in my life. Since the first 50K in 1987 members were a bit slow to participate. Five or six years later, Joan Pellier, Jackie Halberg, Bob and others brought in the idea of medals and a presentation lunch. From all members we say thank you.

Well, I am the mystery man of Charlie's. It is two weeks today I have been here and have had the best of every facility going to help me. But the doctors still don't know what is wrong. I am coming good but have not run since 12/7/98. That is the longest time off since I started with the Club in April, 1979. This year, on the drink stations of the three events, I watched Dave the Carr go through and back, and I thought when I start running and could catch up with him, I'll give him some coaching about his arms and upper body movement (although it seems to work very well for him!).
