





MY GATESHEAD TRIUMPH

I was born in Gateshead and have dozens of kin there as far away from each other as you can chuck a lump of coal. Not that there's much coararound there now, all the 400 Durham mines are closed. And certainly you are not allowed to burn coal any more - have to use natural gas for your central heating.

I've a cousin working on the old coalfield as a ski instructor - they use artificial grass on a contoured slope that used to be known as the pit heap.

I went to Gateshead to run but shortly before I left Perth I caught a really heavy infection - bronchitis with a barking cough. The doctor gave me some antibiotics for it and decided I would run anyway, having entered for the Marathon, the 10k track, 5 k track and the 10 k cross country. I barked and bulged all through the flight across to the UK and noted at least one other person on the plane with my cough - a German girl who had been on a backpacking holiday and had caught her cough in Perth.

I had not been able to train for a couple of weeks, was finishing off my second course of antibiotics and by the time I arrived at Newcastle airport knew that I was unlikely to be able to complete a marathon and the track events so I settled for the cross country and ran it in fine style - but towards the rear of the pack. This suited me because I had to stop three times to clear mucous from my

throat. I noted several of the men fell in the cross country - they weren't lifting their knees on an uneven grass or gravel surface. In case anyone thinks they missed anything, our Vets cross country courses in Kings Park, Reabold Hill and Jorgensen Park are infinitely more interesting.

One of the things I missed most at Gateshead were the birds - I saw only a few starlings, sparrows, the odd seagull, stray pigeons and very occasionally, a blackbird or a mistlethrush.

Where I live in Perth, near the Canning River regional park, we see many large birds, apart from the pelicans roosting on the light standards along the Kwinana Freeway, you are always seeing a white ibis with a black bill, Senegal doves, western wattle birds, parrots, pink and grey galahs, white faced heron, black faced cuckoo shrike, and lots of honey eaters.

Running round the regional park early in December, I felt something wriggling underfoot and saw a most indignant little dugite making a hasty exit off the path. I'm not sure who was most surprised, me or the snake. I have a heavy footfall and snakes usually get out of the way when I'm coming.

Anyway at Gateshead I trained in the back streets and was joined by lots of enthusiastic young boys, bored with school holidays during their summer heat wave. I explained carbohydrate loading to them, gave them each a party size Mars bar and off we'd go. I'd take them through an easy warm up, ten minutes of tempo, then a few fast stride outs. Then we'd return to my brother's house and I'd rehydrate them with juice, water, Diet Coke or whatever.

The kids thought I was great and wanted to come back to Perth with me. To them I was clearly a world class athlete and they were around all the time wanting to train with me.

One day I ran past my Aunt Sadie's hair dressing salon. Sadie is 85 and still works - she has to do something to keep herself occupied - and also makes lunches for her daughter, Pat, who is the district nurse, my brother, Fred, and sometimes Pat's offsider and also her daughter, Jayne.

I also had lunch with her daily. The day I ran past, I stopped and entered - all these elderly ladies were sitting there under dryers, they had been going to Sadie's for years.

One of the customers I noticed on another visit was soon engaged in an animated deep and meaningful conversation with my brother Fred, a retired police chief, who has recycled his scene of the crime expertise from the CID to retrieval of information in marine archaeology sites.

The old girl talking with him had tremendous vitality and a lovely clear spirit aura about her. She had apparently recovered from cancer and had a wonderful free and open manner. She was telling Fred about her girlhood at Lindisfarne, the holy island off the Northumbrian coast.

As a girl she used to collect sea shells known as St Cuthbert's buttons for sale to tourists. When My brother and I have always been interested in this approach because we were feral children during the World War 2, when folk also had to learn to make do.

Another time we were driving around North West Durham and my brother stopped near an old farmhouse. He pointed out that some of the dressed stones were probably taken from an old Roman fort nearby. He asked me what I made of a ledge near the roof. I hadn't a clue but he thought he had read somewhere that it was the practice in the 17th century to leave

ledges like that as a convenience to witches flying by. The witches appreciated this courtesy and spared the residents from harm. It was as good an explanation as any other.

I must say, I get a lot out of my running. I find it fascinating. Gateshead was a triumph. The kids thought I was heroic. Oh, by the way, I came 63rd in the Cross Country. I would have been 62nd if the old buffer in front of me hadn't got up and kept going after he had tripped and fallen.
