



SECRETARY'S REPORT 1990/91

A Report on the activities of the Club for 1990/91

COMPETITIONS

Regular Sunday morning meetings were held throughout the year. The numbers competing continue to rise, requiring more and more organisation to keep the meeting at a high level and to maintain the necessary level of safety. Congratulations to all the race directors and their assistants for the quality of the runs throughout the year.

The summer time trials were held on Wednesday evenings.

These were again very successful though numbers were a little down on last year.

A number of our members competed with the AAWA in both summer and winter seasons. The winter competitors were particularly successful with a fourth place in the men's 'A' grade, second in men's 'C' grade and fourth in the women's "A" grade. Well done everyone.

Successful Track and Field Championships were held at Coker Park, a most enjoyable meeting. The timing of the long distance events will be changed this year to try to avoid the heat. Road running, Cross Country and Road Walk Championships were well attended and testify to the popularity of these events. Thanks are due to all who organised and helped at these meetings.

SOCIAL

A number of popular social events were held throughout the year thanks to a very active

Social Sub-Committee. These events included the social after the Jorgensen Park Championships, a car rally on July 8th, the sausage sizzler after the Kings Park Run, a carbohydrate pack at Al Piccios, and the long weekends at Rottnest and Eaton: a most comprehensive and enjoyable The WACA programme. provided a most pleasant venue for the club dinner, the highlight of the social scene. ADMINISTRATION

The club continues to maintain a membership over 400. The numbers now involved require thought to be given to the running of the club, as it is no longer possible to carry out all the necessary functions as someone's spare time hobby.

Extra help has been willingly given to the running of the events, however other areas do need some careful consideration.

VETRUN

The Club newsletter has been trialed in a new format for several months now, but at an additional cost. The changes will be discussed at the AGM so that the members can decide what it expects and requires of its newsletter and at what cost.

COMPUTER

The volume of data processed is considerable. We are still relying on the home computers of a number of members. The problem has been considered by the committee over the last year but it has not been possible to resolve the problem of how to cover the diversity of

tasks and the diversity of people doing them. This matter will no doubt need further thought next year.

CLUB EVENTS
