This was established three years ago, with Basil Worner, Ann Turner, and Jim Greenfield appointed, but we now need to increase their numbers.

The committee is also looking at

offering a first aid course, so that other members can qualify.

As a voluntary organisation, we can't guarantee that there will always be a first-aider to hand. There are also logistical difficulties in providing on-the-spot assistance when runners are spread across an area of 10kms or more.

We do ask all members to show consideration for anyone who is injured. Stop, and offer help.

Once the club has a number of first aid officers, a list of their names will be given to each race director, who will be asked to ensure that at least one officer will be present at the run.

If you have a first aid qualification, or are interested in attending a course, please give your name to one of the committee members.
