OLYMPIC ADVENTURE

FIRST THOUGHTS. Just over two years ago I read a newspaper article about volunteers for the Sydney Games. As I saw it, the idea of being a volunteer had a fair bit going for it. Having had a love affair with the Olympics Games since Helsinki in '52, the prospect of being part of the Sydney Games had an almost magnetic appeal. TV coverage would probably be the usual inadequate, frustrating mishmash so no great loss there. But could I handle working at the Games and seeing no sport? 'Yes.' Decision made.

FIRST STEPS. I registered an interest in October, 1998 and in December, 1998, submitted a detailed application that covered work and recreational experience and preferred jobs and venues. The application also required personal details for security vetting.

THINGS START TO HAPPEN. In June, 2000, I was offered a position in Spectator Services. These volunteers could be located at airports, railway and bus stations, hotels, venues, anywhere, in fact, that visitors would need assistance. This seemed pretty good to me. I accepted and booked my flights.

In August, I received a letter advising that I would be a Host, Spectator Services, and would be deployed at the Olympic Stadium. A work roster was attached that showed that I would work there on the days leading up to and including the Opening Ceremony, on each day of the Athletics, the Soccer Final, and the Closing Ceremony. Total disbelief was a fair description of my state of mind when I read this. Shifts were nine or ten hours each, the earliest starting at 05.30 hrs, the latest finishing at 01.00 hrs. Ahem!

ALL ROADS LEAD TO SYDNEY. When I walked into the transit lounge at Perth Airport the reality of the Games struck home. Teams from Angola, Namibia and Zambia were waiting to re-board their flight from Jo'burg. Athletes in track-suits; officials in blazers and flannels. What a thrill. A training session in Ultimo. Accreditation and uniform collection in Redfern. I was raring to go.

OLYMPIC STADIUM. There were several hundred volunteers per shift and jobs were allocated at random to ensure variety. Each incoming shift had a motivational session first to get everyone laughing and cheering and eager to get started. These really worked.

We were on our feet for the entire shifts but we coped. We were entitled to two ten-minute breaks and a meal-break per shift. Everyone fitted in a meal-break but we were all so busy

that other breaks were often	missed.	Few	complaints,	we
were having too much fun!				

I worked on Media access control, vehicle access control, crowd marshalling, crowd control, spectator access on turnstiles, spectator seating, gate duties, IAAF Lounge access control, patrolling various areas and problem-solving for spectators in and around the Stadium. I also did access control at the warm-up track. All these brought me into contact with many IOC and National OC members, hundreds of athletes and Ceremony performers, and thousands of spectators.

One of the joys of the job was keeping the spectators and others happy. This wasn't hard. Everybody arriving at the Stadium was in a state of happy anticipation. When they left, they had enjoyed some good entertainment and were fairly contented.

They weren't the only ones. I was on a 'high' after every shift and couldn't wait for the next one to come around. Job satisfaction was excellent.

THE VOLUNTEERS. Over 45,000 turned out to help make the Games an outstanding success. All of those I saw, at all hours and in many different places, were unceasingly cheerful and helpful. They made the difference between success and failure. They were the human face of the Games.

FINAL THOUGHTS ON VOLUNTEERING. Many of us give our time to organisations, e.g. the Vets. However, volunteering is a two-way street between organisations and individuals and it is important that, for organisations to benefit, they put volunteers' skills to good use. People considering volunteering should ask themselves two questions. One, will helping be rewarding for me? Two, will I be able to make a difference? If the answer to either is "No" then look for something else.
