Club members shine

MORE than a hundred of our athletes and supporters travelled to the national capital for the Australian Masters Championships.

They earned national and state records and abundant PBs. It was obvious that our Thursday and Tuesday competitions are the foundation for such strong performances.

Throwers were brilliant. The Glass family was outstanding. Byrony Glass set an Australian record in the hammer, gold in weight, shot, pentathlon. Kate won gold in weight, hammer pentathlon with Lyndsey coaching them and other throwers. Greg Urbanowicz is the strong man of the club, with a heavy weight throw of 14.40m. Just try lifting that implement. At the magnificent, purpose-built cross country course at the Stromlo Forest Park complex, Gillian Young overcame her recent interruptions to training with a convincing win. The Langfords, Jim (first) and Ross were also among the medallists. Gillian had earlier achieved the best age graded performance in the 2000m steeples, for all women.

WA won two relays to rapturous cheers from the stands. Forming a combination from a relatively small pool is difficult; this is a significant result.

Some of the less-experienced athletes, like Vicki Cobby, Carmel Meyer and Melissa Foster (gold for long, jump, triple jump and pentathlon) and Nicole Pinel showed obvious delight at their performances. They are probably still smiling.

The ACT Veterans provided a first class meeting. They do not have a big membership, but were able to gather competent officials, who worked tirelessly for four days and no doubt for months before. We thank them.

Next step is Brazil where Australia will be well represented.

An overall impression is that those who did well had trained well and either avoided injury or managed their injuries.

Many of those at the carnival talked about the World Championships in Perth in 2016 and indicated that they were coming.

At the social, awards went to Lyn Ventris for outstanding athlete and David Carr for middle distance.

Records fall at Canberra nationals

A total of 16 new state records were set at Canberra, three of which were also Australian records. Byrony has set many ARs but this is the first season for both Melissa and Gillian to reach this level. Byrony also threw close to her world record in the weight throw.

Mal Clarke had a purple patch in the field events, winning all M40 throws, throws pentathlon and high jump, making a total of seven gold medals. Also in the field, Greg Urbanowicz won the prestigious throws Champion of Champions.

Rudy Kocis competed in the sprint Champion of Champions finishing mid field. Rudy's M50 200m victory in 23.86 (at 94.59%) was a highlight and one of the most entertaining events to watch, winning in a blanket finish.


Other perennial high percentage scorers, David Carr and Lorraine Lopes again scored highly in numerous events. Lorraine achieved 92.81%, 92.93% and 94.16% in the 800, 1500 and 5000m. David's efforts were

92.29%, 97.49% and 93.23% in the 200, 400 and 800m. Sprinter Rob Colling recorded 91.23% in his 100m M40 State record of 11.40.



It was extra special that my first Nationals was at the AIS track during Canberra's Centenary year. It was a roller coaster experience, some disappointments, some moments of pure elation. The support from team WA was phenomenal. As I ran the 800m on Day one I was able to power on to a PBA as I heard my name called out all around the track. One lovely surprise was the support of fellow competitors from other states. They took this newbie under their wing, providing advice and encouragement. Wonderful!

One highlight was our 4x100m relay. Marg and Peggy decided our 220+ age combo – Jacqui, Brenda, Lynne and myself. I hadn't done a relay since school but Lynne gave us a brilliant "tutorial" just prior to the event and it all came together as planned. We came in second but first place was DQ'd so...my first Nationals gold!

When I told friends that I was going to Canberra for Easter they all screwed up their faces in surprise, almost pitying me. I didn't understand why, I grew up in Canberra and it holds lots of childhood memories. I remember Canberra before Black Mountain Tower,before the high court and before the new parliament house. I remember running cross country around Lake Burley Griffin every weekend in winter and little athletics at Aranda Oval in summer and my "Bob Beamon" leap of 4.40m in the U10s (it's still the club record!).

I remember seeing Marita Koch run 400m very quickly (too quick as it turned out) on the newly built tartan athletics track at Bruce stadium. At Bruce, I remember practising long jump off six strides and backing into the late Ken Lorraway who was practising his triple jump off his long run on the opposite pit, then walking past seeing him have a ciggy in the car park on way home. PB, (a direct result of time spent in the gym this last six months) and with the quality of the competition. Decent efforts in the javelin (yes that was me in the highlights package on the Canberra edition of the ABC news on Friday night) and 800m left me well pleased with my long day.

Canberra's organisation was solid but not outstanding. After proudly announcing the programme was on time at 3pm, my 800m ran 45 minutes late at 4.45pm. A good thing was the canteen, sandwiches, fruit and hot chips ... fantastic compared to the catering some years.



But with two silver medals and a bronze i was happy enough with my weekend and looking forward to next year.

As expectations were low, I decided not to take my racing too seriously and to enjoy my limited time in Canberra. This commenced on the night before the start of the championships when the likes of Marg Saunders and Graeme Dahl lead me astray at the opening ceremony and I ate too many sausage rolls and drank too much beer. Ironically, Marg had recently written articles in *Vetrun* about some of the scientific aspects of running training and preparation!

Later I ate a full pizza for dinner with a bottle of Pepsi. The next morning I consumed a large bacon and eggs breakfast and as my 800m event wasn't scheduled until late afternoon, I walked from my motel to the Parliament House precinct and back, a total of about 12kms. Returning to my motel after three hours of sightseeing, I ate a plate of chips for lunch with a coke before setting off to walk to the stadium.




I walked and I walked and I walked ... mostly all uphill ... a distance of about seven kms!

This was only my second national champs, so I was looking forward to meeting up with some old adversaries – namely Darren Hughes, who had just joined the M50 group and Dave Isackson, both from NSW.

Darren had been running faster times than I had ever produced, so the brain has already conceded to taking three silver medals and coming home satisfied.

All heats went according to plan. I was slow away in the 60m final, and if you give anyone a half metre start in the 60 it is all over very quickly – so my first silver. However, I did notice that I took some ground off the winner (Darren Hughes).

I got away well in the 100m final and when we crossed the line I was looking at lane two and Darren was looking across at me in lane six as we lunged the tape – a long anxious wait and Darren got it by 6/100ths of a second.

The next day I felt very strong in the heat of the 200m, setting up a great final.

Darren tore past me on the inside in the final and I resisted the temptation to follow, noticing that Dave had also gone out hard. At the bend with 90m to go, Darren had a four metre lead with Dave about three metres in front, so I just knuckled down and bit by bit took ground off them both. Dave muttered something like "you mongrel" as I went past him toward the finish.

We all lunged the line with Darren hitting the ground at the finish.

I managed to get the gold by 4/100ths, Darren Hughes the silver with Dave a further 1/100th behind, with a massive PB as well.

Who said the M50 sprinters are not competitive!

Either way it was such a great race to be involved in, one that leaves a lasting impression and brings you back for more.

No doubt there will be much rivalry between the three of us for years to come.

Footnote: Darren has since had an operation to insert a plate into his collarbone which was broken in several places.







The team of Carmel Meyer, Lynne Choate, Carol Bowman and Margaret Saunders were also very happy the following day when they also won gold in the 220+ 4x400m relay. The 120+ team of Nicole Pinel, Cathy McLoskey, Vicki Cobby and Melissa Foster placed second in the 4x100m.

Campbell Till was the men's relay coordinator. The men's 240+ 4x100m team of Norm Richards, Nick Miletic, Leon Sander and Stephen Fuller ran well to finish third. The 180+4x400m team of David Solomon, Stephen Fuller, Andrew Brooker and Colin Smith proved that multi eventers are physically fit and strong. Having just completed the 1500m as part of their pentathlon Stephen and Andrew ran well and their team finished a very creditable second.




