13. OTHER BUSINESS

- a. Possibility of change to start times according to the season:
B. Slinger proposed B. Danby seconded, earlier starting times in Summer, later in winter, the decision to be left to the discretion of the Committee. Motion defeated.
R. Farrell proposed G. Thornton seconded, Summer times only be adjusted at the discretion of the Committee, carried.
- b. Date of Annual dinner: Members felt a change would be beneficial, left to the discretion of the Committee.
- c. Continuance of Library: D. Strachan proposed P. Martin seconded Committee to take control of same with the elected Librarian in charge for a period of 12 months and report back at the next AGM. Carried.
- d. Ultra Runners Club: T. Tripp thanked the Vets Club for their support during the year and advised the date of the next 24 hr. This will be 28 and 29 May 1988. Also the Perth to Albany will be around 29.9.88, crews are required.
- e. Honorarium for Secretary: John Pellier requested that this be brought to the attention of future Secretaries.
- f. A. Pomery requested that this year's Club Half Marathon be held without a lesser distance over the same course. R. Sammells, as race director has undertaken to attend to.
- g. B. Slinger proposed seconded D. Strachan seconded that all State Championship events be held at the same venue over the same weekend for all members. Carried.
- h. R. Farrell proposed D. Strachan seconded that next years State Champs be held over the Easter weekend, motion defeated.
- i. R. Sammells requested that Race Directors be responsible for collection of fees at Sunday races.
- j. Clubrooms: M. Fermor asked for progress report. B. Worner gave brief report based on Committee discussions during year. (See Committee minutes) Further follow up to be made by Committee.
- k. Club Equipment: D. Strachan proposed B. Danby seconded, all types of Club equipment will not in future be issued for personal use. Carried.

The President declared the meeting closed at 9.35pm.

1. SUNDAY RUNS

The committee agreed that we should aim at starting our runs promptly on the scheduled time. This was usually achieved by calling members to the line about ten minutes before, thus getting our announcements out of the way.

We were not so successful in keeping to the year's programme. For a number of reasons, one or two changes were made and we soon had a domino effect.

This was disappointing in view of the many hours which went into the planning. We suggest that the programme remains unchanged. If a member is unable to host a run, then it has proved better to have a substitute organize the run so that the Club programme does not continue to suffer the effect of one alteration, perhaps even a quite justifiable one.

Thanks to the Race Directors on the day, especially to those who hosted "Home Runs", which are such a feature of our Club.

2. SOCIAL

The committee organized a camp at Eaton and another at Fairbridge. The former was well-attended and successful. The Fairbridge fixture was cancelled because of lack of numbers.

The Club dinner at Sereaglio Park was reasonably well-attended but required considerable promotion. It became evident that this function, close to Christmas and clashing with the World Games, was not popular and the committee, at one stage, was in two minds whether to proceed.

The problem is now one of expense in providing a dinner-dance at that time of year.

It is evident that most members appear to be satisfied with the "cup of tea and biscuit" after our runs as the focal point of our social life.

Members will need to consider whether they require other social functions and at what level.

Three functions were held during the year :

"Orientation" evening for new members

World Games film evening at the Raffles

An evening with Bob De La Motte and the Comrades Marathon.

In 1986, two thirds of our new members attended the social and orientation evening. In 1987, we had about 12. It was considered interesting and useful and worth pursuing with a better promotion. Our thanks to the Committee and others who helped, including Dick Horsley and Don Caplin.

David Carr organized the World Athletics Cup evening which attracted about 20 members.

Bob Sammells arranged for Bob De La Motte to show a video and talk about the famous Comrades Marathon. This was a disappointing turn-up to what was a fascinating evening.

3. TRACK AND FIELD

The Club continued to offer twilight meets before and after Christmas and concluded the season with its state championship.

Numbers at the twilight meet were slightly down on the previous year. The World Games affected our normal schedule and our attempt to provide a proper lead-in to these Games was not entirely successful. The honour system of track fees worked satisfactorily.

There was a serious difficulty in providing equipment, though on only one occasion were we unable to stage a throwing event. It is suggested that, next year, specific throwing events be scheduled for each of the two venues and that we negotiate with the two clubs to store the throwing equipment with them. This would also make the programming tighter,

State Championships

These attracted about the same number as in 1987. The twilight 10k proved to be a success and the organizers of the 1990 meet could well consider moving the Sunday programme to Saturday and making the 5K run a twilight event also. The past four years have given us temperatures which are becoming dangerous for sustained running and a slot in a cooler time of day is also likely to give our distance runners a chance to perform at their best.

Our thanks to all members who supported this Club event, especially our country contingent. Thanks also to the groups who ran the following areas so efficiently : registration and results, catering, officials, technical equipment.

It is appropriate to make special mention of Colin Leman who provided not only his expertise but also his computer over the two days.

Liaison and Competition - Athletics Association

Our Club again organized the "George Skeels " Cross Country run for the Association and some 20 of our members took part in the winter cross country season finishing second in the C Grade. Our thanks to Brian Foley who was our faithful liaison and co-ordinator of the winter season.

Our thanks to Club members who assisted in the recent senior Australian Championships, led by Dick Horsley , Charlie Spare and Bruce Wilson

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4. WORLD GAMES

Congratulations to all our members who participated in this event. While we were successful in winning 23 medals, all members came away well-satisfied with either PBs, state records or just "good efforts".

Special congratulations to World Record breakers Pat Carr, Dorothy Whittam and Eileen Hindle and Australian record breaker David Carr who brought great credit on our Club.

5. AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS,

Towards the end of 1987, the Committee invited David Carr to chair a Championship Organizing Committee. This is a sub-committee of the Club Committee and was set up at this stage to ensure that the normal Club administration would not be interrupted by this event

The Organizing Committee has met three times and assigned portfolios. It has prepared a promotion leaflet which has been distributed at the Australian Championships in Brisbane in Easter, 1988.

The Organizing Committee will be seeking assistance from many members in specific areas over the next year to ensure that our championship will be efficient and pleasant.

6. SAFETY

The Committee became aware of the increased numbers in our club and the potential risks in some runs. An effort was made to remind members about safety and courtesy and also to provide marshalls in critical places.

Members should be aware that, under the law, we have a duty of care to other citizens using public facilities and the in-coming Committee may need to consider whether some of our runs have now become "unsafe" when used as racing courses. In particular, the Bridges course, at certain times, has a notable hazard at the Barrack Street jetty.

7. FUND-RAISING

The committee organized a quiz night held at the Rugby Rooms. This raised \$850 and our thanks to Barrie Slinger and his team of helpers for a fruitful and profitable evening.

Our special thanks also to those who provided prizes for the function.

8. AUSTRALIAN ASSOCIATION OF VETERAN ATHLETIC CLUBS - INCORPORATION

This became an issue in March when the move to incorporate involved also a suggestion for a substantial change in the administration of the national body.

The Committee felt that the situation called for an extra-ordinary general meeting. This was held on March 28 and passed the following resolutions :

- i. That the W.A.V.A.C. agree to the incorporation of the national body but making only those changes to the constitution which are legally necessary for incorporation.
- ii. That, while the W.A.V.A.C. supports incorporation in principle, it requests a delay before our endorsement of the proposed constitution.
- iii. That the W.A.V.A.C. requires clarification and reasons for any changes in the constitution of A.A.V.A.C. before it considers the proposed constitution.

This meeting was well-attended and the members are to be congratulated for their interest and for their thoughtful approach to this issue. The situation was potentially divisive but the discussion indicated that members were prepared to hear all aspects of the case before taking any drastic action.

SECRETARYS REPORT FOR 1987/88AIM

The Aim of this report is to cover the activities of the Club as laid down in the Constitution.

SOCIAL EVENTS

Jorgensen Park : This event continues to be a popular one on the Calendar despite the sometimes adverse weather conditions. A more than ample lunch was provided by Club members and the kitchen was manned by an ever willing group of members and their spouses, too many to mention.

Home runs : A total of eight home runs were listed on the 1987/88 Calendar and I feel that these people who open up their homes to sometimes up to 100 Club members deserve a mention. Despite increasing numbers it is hoped that we can continue to take advantage of the generosity of these members, as these are surely some of the events that help make our Club unique.

Long weekends : Fairbridge in September, unfortunately this had to be cancelled due to lack of support. Eaton in March, once again a pleasant weekend on the banks of the Collie River. Forty eight members and their families attended for the reasonable charge of \$12 each for the three days. Thanks to M. Stoffers for assisting with final arrangements and to H. Stoffers and the Bunbury Runners Club for marking and conducting our runs. An additional feature this year was the Eaton Veterans Games under the control of the Warrens and the Davis's, a successful afternoon enjoyed by all, perhaps again next year. Quiz night : With Barrie Slinger conducting the evening the Quiz night was held on 28th August 1987 at Perry Lakes Rugby Clubrooms.
