





HANDICAP CHAMPIONSHIPS 1986/87

During the past 12 months we had 174 Competitors in the 1986/87 handicap. Points were allocated as follows:-

1 point for the winner, 2 for the second, 3 for third and so on.

Non participants were allocated points equal to the last competitor plus 1.

Obviously those favoured to win would be those competitors who ran in the most number of events available, and this is the way the championship finally turned out.

A convincing winner was Margery Forden who competed in 9 of the 10 events available.

Second was Vic Beaumont competing in 8 events and third was Paul Martin competing in 7 events.

Next year's championship will be decided on six events as shown in the club programme.

The Westfield Run 1987 - Sydney to Melbourne

As many of you may already know our country member, George Audley, recently completed the 1060 km Sydney to Melbourne run in 8 days 1 hour and 35 minutes which placed him in sixth position overall. We spoke to him of his experiences:-

Ed: What were your feelings at the start?

George: Same as any other run, - just a bit worried as a strange bed had only let me have one or two hour's sleep. Found out later that the experienced multiday runners took sleeping tablets, ... next time!!

Ed: How long ago did you start your training?

George: About March 1985 for a 24-hour run with the Sydney/ Melbourne at the back of my mind.

Ed: What did you eat and drink en route?

George: Very little solids. I drank Sustagen and a Polycose/ Water drink (5% polycose). Otherwise I ate biscuits, bread and jam, beans on toast, soup and bread, lolliesicypoles.

Ed: Did you lose much weight?

George: Weight was checked about 8 times each day. There was no loss or gain.

Ed: How much did it cost to make your attempt?

George: About \$9000 but this includes the cost of taking my own crew from W.A. Although a part of this was raised by my family I received very strong local support from the people of Albany, - people would stop me in the street to give money to enable me to enter. Whereas I looked upon other distance attempts as my own, this one belonged very much to the town which identified closely with my participation

Ed: What shoes did you wear?

George: I started with a pair of Hi-Tec but as my feet began to swell I reverted to an old pair of Adidas Webb shoes. They were modified by having the tongues and much of the toe box cut out. The heels just wore down and down and down!

Ed: How about your running technique - were any tactics involved?

George: I developed a leg injury and had to adapt my style to suit the injury. Because of the injury I spent more time running but at a slower pace. My mileage increased I went up to over 120 and on the last day I did over 130. It was a big learning experience as, after the injury, I built up. Now I know what to do - I've got to run slower but not spend so much time off the road. You've got to alter your style to more or less a shuffle.

Ed: How did you keep a check on your speed?

George: I run mainly using a pacing watch - I had it beeping on 95 times a minute which gave me 190 steps a minute. I kept a mental count which I checked with my crew who would beep the horn every quarter hour.



Ed: What were your feelings at the end?

George: Relief, - elation. I got strong public support and this was particularly wonderful at the finish which took place in the daylight. As there is a considerable gap in time between finishers each one gets a full reception from both the officials and the media.

Ed: A lot of people suffer from a 'low' after a long run. Did this happen to you?

George: Not yet. I still can't go around Albany without having my hand shaken and people saying "well-done." There was a big reception held for myself and my crew in Albany on our arrival followed by a Civic Reception the next day. I have been the guest of honour at several other functions in Albany. I still feel a sense of elation, but each run I've done I've been disappointed - I've never reached my target - this run still took my a day longer than I'd hoped it would.

Ed: So you'll have another go at it?

George: Oh yes! We've already got donations coming in.

Ed: You have obviously enjoyed the well deserved fame. Would you recommend that our members give it a go?

George: If you can run 100 miles in 24 hours you can run the Sydney/Melbourne event. All in all it was a wonderful experience and the weather was good. I only really noticed the downhills. With all the waving and horn-blowing even during the hours of darkness my crew said they felt like royalty! If it's your dream, then do it. If you need advice write to me and I'll help all I can.

Ed: Thank you George. We all wish you continued success in your running.

BUNBURY MARATHON/HALF MARATHON 03/05/87

Due to a change of date this very popular event unfortunately clashed with our own Andy Wright Memorial Run this year. It was run in calm, cool but brilliantly sunny conditions.
